SUGGESTIONS FOR THE REMAINDER OF LENT

- **Eat less** and abstain from meats and dairy products at least on Wednesdays and Fridays, as a way of denying yourself and building physical and spiritual discipline.
- **Repent daily** and honestly, trying to eliminate certain sins and shortcomings from your life, with God’s help.
- **Read and pray**, ideally on a daily basis. Concentrate on Holy Scripture (even a paragraph a day) and make the time to dialogue with God through prayer.
- **Be more charitable** with your time, talent and resources. Find someone who needs you and serve this person as you would Christ Himself.
- **Attend worship services regularly**, from Sunday Divine Liturgy to PreSanctified Liturgy and, especially, Holy Week.

Our Lenten journey began on Clean Monday and leads to Pascha, the climax of this spiritual pilgrimage, when we reaffirm our profound belief that... *“Christ is Risen from the Dead, By Death Trampling Upon Death, Granting Life to Those in the Tombs!”*

BUILDING ON OUR FAITH

Now that the steel is being erected for our new parish, many have asked, “When will our new church be finished so we can celebrate Liturgy, plan weddings, christenings and other sacraments?” It is evident many parishioners are logging onto the St. Demetrios website (www.stdemetriusweston.org) and that this site is becoming a very valuable tool for the parish to keep up to date not only with the “Building on our

Faith” project, but with all church announcements and activities. It is evident because when many ask, “Will it really be done before the end of the year?”—clearly they have read the “Project Updates” section.

The answer is, “Yes.” Although it may seem like this is impossible, our schedule has always called for the project to be completed before year

end. Success is to honor our mandate to build a solid, permanent edifice in our Orthodox tradition and Byzantine style. Along the way expect some dramatic events such as the placement of our 4 domes, including the main dome raising 64 feet above the ground. Check the website for more details as many will want to take a couple hours off work to appreciate this special moment. Each dome will be topped by a cross. Raising, especially, the main dome’s cross—and permanently installing it—will be an event for a special Sunday in May or June depending on the church schedule. Of course, there is so much more to celebrate.

Of the required funding, 70% has been pledged but we still must raise \$2.3 million. Many parishioners have indicated they are contemplating their commitment, and some are discussing this with their family or extended families in honor, or in memory, of their loved ones. As these dramatic and inspiring waypoints in the life of our project approach, it is surely a great time to actually make that sacrificial, once-in-a-lifetime gift that will remain part of the legacy of St Demetrios. Remember, no pledge is too small or too big. We are guided by the biblical reference to the poor widow, whose small gift is remembered as part of the history of our faith because she gave all from the heart, and it was the best she could do! Those that can commit to a larger gift will help us achieve our goal sooner and in the end carry less debt. All of us should be included and be recognized as playing a part in this great moment in the history of our church where we affirm our living faith!



ST. TIKHON OF MOSCOW Commemorated April 7



St. Tikhon was born in 1865 and reposed in 1925. From his early years he displayed great love for the Church; he was also known for his remarkable humility. During his time at seminary, he stood out as a quick learner and further developed his deep love for God. Because of this, his classmates referred to him as “Patriarch.” After his ordination, St. Tikhon became a missionary to North America, converting many people to Christianity and establishing the Diocese of the Aleutians and North America. He brought his love for learning to the new land, and he became an expert sailor and proficient speaker of the native languages. Because of his faith, humility and willingness to help everyone he encountered, he eventually

became Patriarch of the Russian Orthodox Church. His life-long work for the Church, and her people, is captured in this wonderful quotation from St. Tikhon: “May God teach every one of us to strive for His truth, and for the good of the Holy Church, rather than something for our own sake.”

Getting Practical: Often we forget that we are blessed with a host of modern saints, many that spent years in North America and some that were even born here! Post St. Tikhon’s picture on the “fridge,” as well as his holy icon. Point out to your children that they are both images of the same man—and help them understand that people who dedicate their lives to God can indeed become saints. This is a potential that lies within us all.

tions of our parish and communities. Their legacy is the stewardship which they created by giving their time, talents and treasures to build the Greek Orthodox communities which we now call home. Most importantly, let us not forget to consider our Lord. His many gifts made this precious legacy possible. He blessed those former generations as He blesses us now. Everything good in our lives comes from Him.



*“There is not a shorter verse in the Bible, nor a larger text.”
—John Donne (1572 – 1631)*

Long ago, the priest and poet John Donne expressed what we instinctively feel when we read the Lazarus story: how amazing that Christ would actually weep—not just shed a tear but weep—for His dead friend. Sometimes we mistakenly think of Jesus as ethereal or untouchable. Though true God, He was also true man, experiencing everything we do: deep love, friendship, the pain of loss.

On these trying days perhaps Jesus also weeps for us—His tears a well-spring of hope, anticipating the joyful raising of Lazarus, as well as His own Resurrection. As Holy Week approaches, we take comfort in this “larger text” of His weeping: the great, compassionate and saving heart of our Lord....
